Resource List Leadership, Supervisory, Management training

This list of resources has been compiled for the use of Kansas Association of Local Health Department (KALHD) members as they strive to continue the development of the highly effective public health workforce and to increase their individual skills in these topic areas.

The resources identified are Kansas based, with one exception that is foundation focused on public health, with well-established reputations for quality and hundreds or sometimes even thousands of local alumni. Any of these trainings could be a beneficial investment of time and funding for identified health department employees.

- Subjects: Focus will be on leadership competencies identified by the Kansas Leadership Center of Diagnosing the Situation, Managing Self, Energizing Others and Intervening Skillfully
- Cost: \$275 and for travelers traveling greater than 30 miles, one night of hotel will be provided for each session

- Offered as day (one session 9:00-3:00), evening (two sessions 5:30-8:30) and virtual options
- Subjects: Leadership is not about authority and position. Leadership is actually an activity—small actions taken in moments of opportunity. That means everyone can lead, no matter where they sit in an organization or community. And when more people feel empowered to see and seize their moments to lead, we make more progress on our most important challenges
- o Cost: \$149 plus purchase of required texts
